HURRICANE IRMA AND THE ISLANDS OF THE BAHAMAS 9:00 AM EDT, Monday, Sept. 11, 2017 All Clear issued for the entire Bahamas

NASSAU, Bahamas – Sunday, September 10, 2017: The all clear has been given for all islands as business begins to return to normal throughout The Islands of The Bahamas.

AIRPORTS

The Lynden Pindling International Airport in Nassau is open and international flights have resumed operations. Travelers should contact their respective airlines for flight information.

The remaining airports will resume operations once the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) they have been assessed and cleared for opening by aviation officials.

HOTELS

Baha Mar Resort and Casino will resume full hotel, casino and retail operations and will welcome guests back on Tuesday, September 12.

Melia Nassau Beach Resort will resume full operations on Wednesday, September 13.

DAMAGE REPORT

There are no reports of severe damage to the tourism product throughout the Islands of The Bahamas, at this time. Full assessments begin today.

CRUISE

The Port of Nassau reopened on Sunday, however no vessels are expected until Wednesday, September 13. All other ports remain closed at this time. Cruise reservation holders should check directly with their cruise provider for updates on departures and itineraries.
